An avocado-green bathroom, once an aesthetic of someone with dreadful, stuck-in-the-70s bad taste is now facing a trend resurgence. It is the old style of tiles which line the toilet walls of Epp's studio but is also the backdrop of one of his best mirror selfies. The figure holds his Visa credit card under the stream of tap water. He is washing away drug evidence from the night before, making sure no illicit white residue remains on its surface before he uses the card in public tomorrow morning when ordering his Pret coffee. The figure cleaning his credit card also symbolises the act of draining his bank account the night before.
